Our team was awarded 150K over two years from THRF to develop the Cardiac Rehabilitation Especially for Women (CREW) project. In this project, we are building on CHAP to increase the participation in cardiac rehabilitation of women who live in rural South Australia. Over 24 months, we will co-design a web-based CR program with female patients and rural clinicians tailored to women's needs and preferences.



We will then test the program usability, acceptability and efficacy in increasing CR attendance and completion. Thanks to the CREW who supported us for grant submission- we look forward to partnering on this with you in 2022-2023.
