OF THE LARGEST
CARDIAC REHABILITATION
DATA SETS IN
AUSTRALIA!!!**

This month the CHAP data linkage sub-project received approval from the Department for Health and Wellbeing Human Research Ethics Committee. This means CHAP will have a large data set with patients eligible to cardiac rehab from 2016 to 2023. This will enable us to calculate our primary outcome- attendance to CR- among the eligible and not only among the referred patients.

It will also allow accurate assessment of our secondary outcomes - hospital re-admission, deaths and lipids and glycaemic control - through the linkage between the CATCH database and SA Public Hospital Admissions, BDM Codified Cause of Death and SA Pathology databases.

CHAP MEDICATION PROJECT



Detailed medication data variables are set to be included in the CATCH database that enable us to **evaluate evidence based pharmacotherapy** as required by Guidelines.
